Sexual Assault Collection Kits and Sexually-oriented Criminal Offenses Data Collection Survey R.S. 15:624

Criminal Justice Agency	Any government agency or subunit thereof, or private agency that, through statutory authorization or a legal formal agreement with a governmental unit or agency, has the power of investigation, arrest, detention, prosecution, adjudication, treatment, supervision, rehabilitation or release of persons suspected, charged, or convicted of a crime; or that collects, stores, processes, transmits, or disseminates criminal history records or crime information.
Sexual Assault	Any type of sexual contact or behavior that occurs without the consent of the recipient. Sexual assault occurs when a person is forced, coerced, or manipulated into any unwanted sexual activity.
Sexually-oriented Criminal Offenses to report (Question 3)	Includes any sexual assault offenses as defined in R.S. 44:51 and any sexual abuse offense as defined in R.S. 14:403 that the agency needs to report.
“Reported” Sexual Assault Collection Kits in Agency’s Possession (Question 4)	A kit that contains a human biological specimen or specimens collected during a forensic medical examination from the victim of a sexually-oriented criminal offense who <u>reported</u> the crime to law enforcement.
“Unreported” Sexual Assault Collection Kits in Agency’s Possession (Question 5)	A kit that contains a human biological specimen or specimens collected during a forensic medical examination from the victim of a sexually-oriented criminal offense who <u>declined to report</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of “Reported” Sexually-oriented Criminal Offenses (Question 6)	Number of victims of a sexually-oriented criminal offense who <u>reported</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Sexually-oriented Criminal Offense Cases Reported by Status (Question 7)	Open Number of investigations that are still in open status.
	Closed Number of investigations that have been concluded - with or without an arrest.
	Suspended Number of investigations that have not been resolved or there is no active investigation.
	Other Number of investigations that is unfounded, undetermined, or referred out. (I.e. Referred to the District Attorney’s office)
Number of Reported Sexual Assault Collection Kits Received (Question 8)	Number of kits that contain a human biological specimen or specimens collected during a forensic medical examination from the victim of a sexually-oriented criminal offense who <u>reported</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Unreported Sexual Assault Collection Kits Received (Question 9)	Number of kits that contain a human biological specimen or specimens collected during a forensic medical examination from the victim of a sexually-oriented criminal offense who <u>declined to report</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Sexual Assault Collection Kits Requiring Analysis (Question 10)	Number of kits that <u>need to be submitted</u> to the crime lab to be analyzed, because the victim <u>reported</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Sexual Assault Collection Kits Submitted for Analysis (Question 11)	Number of kits that <u>have been submitted</u> to the crime lab to be analyzed, because the victim <u>reported</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Sexual Assault Collection Kits Requiring Analysis, but not Submitted to Crime Lab (Question 12)	Number of kits that <u>need to be submitted</u> to the crime lab to be analyzed, but has not been submitted to the crime lab because the victim <u>declined to report</u> the crime to law enforcement.
Number of Sexual Assault Collection Kits Untested Due to Judicial or Investigative Reason (Question 13)	Number of kits that <u>need to be submitted</u> to the crime lab to be analyzed, but has not been submitted to the crime lab because of judicial or investigative reason. (I.e. District Attorney or law enforcement has confirmed that the kit does not need to be analyzed for various reason).
