I. CALL TO ORDER

A quarterly meeting of the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice was held on Thursday, December 7, 2023, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. Sheriff Sid J. Gautreaux, III, Commission Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:12 a.m.

III. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

B. Report of the Priorities Committee

Chief Craft reported that, on November 15, 2023, the Priorities Committee received all allocations, applications, proposed increases, and waiver requests via electronic mail-out. The Priorities Committee reviewed these items and recommended approval on November 21, 2023. All items will be considered for final approval at the December 7, 2023 Commission meeting.

This concludes the report of the Priorities Committee.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Sheriff Cazes, seconded by Sheriff Martin, and the motion passed.

C. Report of the Victim Services Advisory Board

On behalf of Board Chair Gary “Stitch” Guillory, Mr. Julio Galan reported that the Victim Services Advisory Committee met at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 1 FY 2022 allocation totaling \$30,000
- 2 FY 2022 VOCA applications totaling \$105,933
- 4 FY 2022 VOCA increases totaling \$83,995

This concludes the report of the Victim Services Advisory Board.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Sheriff Cazes, seconded by Sheriff Tubbs, and the motion carried without opposition.

D. Report of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (JJDP) Advisory Board

Ms. ViEve Martin-Kohrs, Board Chair, reported that the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Advisory Board met at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended that the following application be **tabled**:

- 1 application for FY 2020 totaling \$71,662

This concludes the report of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Advisory Board.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Col. Stout, seconded by Chief Dunn, and the motion unanimously passed.

E. Report of the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board

Col. Carlos Stout, Board Chair, reported that the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board met at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 6, 2023, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. A membership quorum was present.

The Board recommended approval of the following:

- 62 allocations for FY 2022 totaling \$1,312,033
- 50 applications for FY 2022 totaling \$1,207,034
- 3 increases for FY 2021 totaling \$40,000 (Grant Numbers 7055, 7059, and 7065)

All of this activity is listed in the eGrants system

This concludes the Drug Control and Violent Crime Policy Board Report.

Chairman Gautreaux called for a motion to accept the report. A motion was made by Mr. Myer, seconded by Chief Dunn, and the motion passed.

F. Update on POST Collections/Expenses

Chief Craft reported that there has been no improvement in collections since the September Commission meeting. He recommended that payment of invoices continue to be suspended until such time as sufficient funding is available and called for a motion to approve. A motion was made by Sheriff Tubbs, seconded by Mr. Bergeron, and the motion passed.

G. Call for Other Old Business

Chairman Gautreaux called for Other Old Business, and there was none to discuss.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. Presentation of Grant District Applications

Chairman Gautreaux called for a presentation of the District grant applications. A motion was made by Sheriff Tubbs to approve all of the District grant applications *in globo*. The motion was seconded by Chief Dunn, and the motion carried without opposition.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Announcement of 2024 Commission Meeting Dates

Chairman Gautreaux announced the following 2024 Commission meeting dates: March 21, 2024, June 6, 2024, September 26, 2024, and December 5, 2024. All meetings will be held at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center.

B. Next Commission Meeting Date

Chairman Gautreaux announced that the next quarterly Commission meeting will be held on Thursday, March 21, 2024, at the West Baton Rouge Conference Center. The advisory boards will meet on Wednesday, March 20, 2024, at the same venue.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

Chairman Gautreaux reported that a total of over \$3,666,879 was awarded to deserving agencies at today's meeting and called for a motion to adjourn.
